#### SCHOOL RULES

#### GENERAL:

- The purpose of these rules is to help in the smooth running of the School; and pupils should realise that bad behaviour injures the reputation of the School as politeness enhances it.
- Outside School, pupils should always recognise courteously members of staff.
- Pupils should wear Madras College uniform on all School occasions.

# I. The following are forbidden:

- The playing of ball games, unless under supervision; the throwing of stones or other missiles (including snowballs); and the introduction of any form of fireworks.
- Running or causing obstruction in any part of the building. Pupils must keep to their right in walking along all corridors.
- 3. The leaving of litter of any type within the precincts of the School.
- The defacing of School property and the alteration of authorised notices.
- The leaving of books, sports gear, clothing, etc., anywhere within the School outwith School hours.
- The shifting of desks and tampering with light switches, blinds, doors or windows.
- Cycling anywhere within the School precincts. Cycles must not be wheeled on paths to the inconvenience of pedestrians. Cycle sheds must not be entered except by cycle owners leaving or removing their own cycles.
- The attaching of the School name or of any class thereof, without the authority of the Rector, to any gathering organised or held in or out of School.

- II. No pupil is permitted, without the authority of the Rector:
  - 1. To leave School during School hours.
  - To be in any room before 9 a.m. or during intervals; to be in any part of the School after 4 p.m.; to enter any room or to be in the corridors of the new building before the bell rings.
  - To enter or leave except by the appropriate entrances, boys' and girls'. The West playground is for girls only.

#### III.

- All garments likely to be discarded during School hours must be clearly marked with the name and class of the owner.
- No valuables may be left in cloakrooms or anywhere else within the School precincts.
- All books must bear the name of the owner in ink. Textbooks must be covered and bear the dates of the session in which the book is in the keeping of the pupil. The School cannot accept responsibility for lost property.

# IV. Members of Staff have authority:

- To supervise the behaviour of pupils, outside as well as inside School, and to enforce obedience to School Prefects.
- Exercise control over all School activities, including parties and publications.

V.

- All pupils who have been absent from School for any reason will, on their return, bring to their Form Teacher a note of explanation signed by a parent or guardian.
- If a pupil has been absent for three days and is likely to be absent for longer, the parent or guardian should inform the Rector of the reason for his or her absence.
